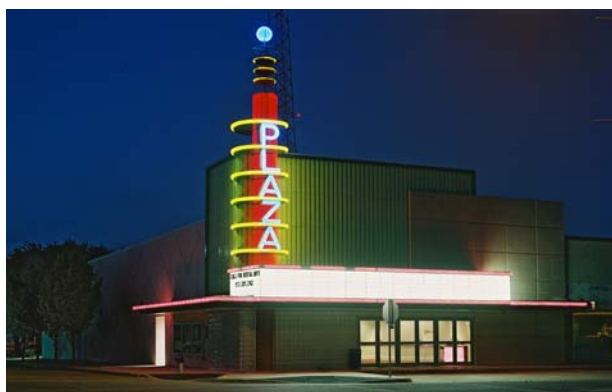

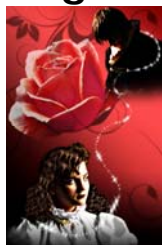

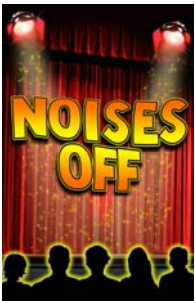
4th Annual Red Hat Talent Show

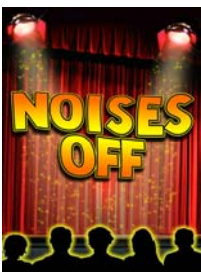

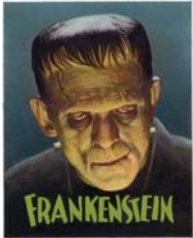
